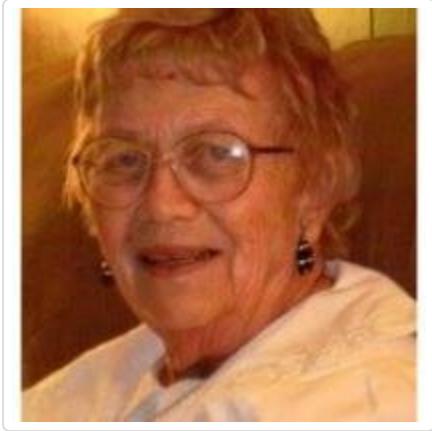




Blanche Fisher
