



Chaim Steinberg

July 11, 1937 - August 12, 2020

Chaim was born in Liberec, Czechoslovakia, to Yitzchak and Pnina Steinberg on July 11, 1937. His parents escaped to British Mandate Palestine in January, 1940. Chaim grew up in Tel Aviv.

From 1955-1958 Chaim served in the Israeli Air Force and participated in the Sinai Campaign in 1956. He subsequently enrolled in the Technion in Haifa, Israel, and graduated with a degree in Electrical Engineering.

In 1964 he met Lea Bushkanietz and they married August 25, 1965. Shortly thereafter they moved to Brooklyn, New York. Chaim achieved his MBA from Baruch College in Manhattan. All three of their children were born in Brooklyn, New York.

In 1975 the family moved back to Israel and lived in Kfar Saba. In 1978 Chaim and his family moved to Houston. In almost 4 decades of his career in Houston, he worked for some of the leading engineering, oil, and gas companies in the area.

During his 42 years in Houston he was a dedicated member of Congregation Beth Yeshurun and the Israeli Irgun of Hebrew Speaking Professionals. He loved going to the JCC to hear talks, attend book fairs, swim and exercise. In the last few years in particular he gained a love for Pickleball which he

enjoyed playing with friends and visiting family. Chaim was an avid reader of history and of Judaism. He loved learning and passing on knowledge. Chaim loved to travel, going on many trips through the years with Lea, his children, and his grandchildren.
