Howard Michael Shapiro, 76, passed away on September 14, 2021 in Dallas, TX surrounded by loving family. Howard was born to Leonard and Roma Shapiro on January 26, 1945 in Detroit, MI. After graduating from Detroit Country Day School in 1962, he attended the University of Michigan where he first earned his BA in history in 1966, and later his medical degree in 1970. He went on to pursue an accomplished career in neuroradiology. He met the love of his life, Linda, in a Jewish photography club in Chicago, IL in 1978, and they married on July 8, 1979. Their first years of marriage were in Chicago, and they moved to Dallas, TX in 1983. They had four children, Deborah, Murray, Samuel, and Rebecca. Howard loved spending time with his family, and would plan regular trips to visit extended family in Chicago and Detroit. He was an avid tennis player and regular swimmer. He enjoyed engaging with the local Jewish community on Shabbat and holidays, film festivals, book fairs, and other special occasions. He will always be remembered for his intellect, warmth, and generosity.
