Jay Maurice Shear, age 98 passed away peacefully on July 6, 2020 in Sugar Land Texas (Houston).

Jay was born in Lewistown, PA. to Harry and Martha Shear on July 7, 1921. Jay met and married Elizabeth in Philadelphia, PA in 1950. Relocated to Tulsa OK in 1956 worked with his brother at Champion Carriers Shear Truck,

manufacturing custom built heavy duty vehicles, then relocated their business to Dallas, TX in 1972. After retirement he volunteered at Frontiers of Flight Museum Dallas for several years. He moved to Sugar Land TX in 2014.

Jay loved airplanes, he had his private pilot license and you could always find him at an airshow or museum. He purchased a motorhome and traveled to all corners of the U.S.

Jay was a very loving, funny and generous father and grandfather and he will be deeply missed.
