Nikki Friedman Bennett, age 68, passed away peacefully surrounded by her family on April 9, 2016. She was born in Brooklyn, NY on December 16, 1947 to Sylvia and Sol Hutt. She lived in New York City and in London, England with her parents, her older sister Marsha, and her younger brother Mitchell. After her family moved to Dallas, she attended school at Stonewall Jackson Elementary School, Franklin Junior High School and graduated from Hillcrest High School. bookkeeper for some local companies, opened a tax store with her friend Barbara, and also did medical billing for several doctors. Upon retiring from her JFS job, Nikki worked alongside husband, Ron Bennett, to build their business, A Better Letter.

Nikki was preceded in death by her first husband, David Friedman; her brother, Mitchell Lloyd Hutt; her daughter, Jodi Friedman; her father, Sol; her mother, Sylvia; and her Stepfather, Morris J. Stein.
