January 29, 1950 - June 12, 2024

Wolf Gloger, 74, of Dallas, Texas, passed away on June 12, 2024, leaving behind a legacy of lifelong learning, entrepreneurship, and devotion to his family. Born on January 29, 1950, in Galicia, Ukraine, to Isaac and Hannah Gloger, Wolf's journey through life was marked by a remarkable thirst for knowledge and a deep appreciation for adventure.

Growing up on a dairy farm in the serene village of Sobota, Poland, Wolf's inquisitive nature led him to become a self-taught polyglot, mastering seven languages throughout his lifetime and sharing his passion for education with those around him. His love for the outdoors and sports, particularly soccer, accompanied him through his youth, as he explored the picturesque Polish countryside with his closest friends.

At the age of 16, Wolf embarked on a new chapter in Israel with his father, where he proudly served in the Israeli Defense Force during the Yom Kippur War of 1973, displaying bravery and resilience in the face of adversity.

Following his military service, Wolf pursued higher education in New York City, attending NYU while working diligently to support himself. His entrepreneurial spirit led him to establish a successful business in Brighton Beach, where fate intervened in the form of Quinnie, the love of his life, who walked into his shop one summer day in 1979. Their whirlwind romance blossomed into 44 years of

unwavering love and companionship.

In 1980, Wolf and Quinnie embarked on a new adventure, relocating to Dallas, Texas, where Wolf managed a zipper textile factory and later pursued his passion for auto repair by opening a thriving business in North Dallas.

In his retirement, Wolf found solace and fulfillment in nurturing his passions. He delighted in cooking for his beloved wife, Quinnie, crafting meals that reflected his love and devotion. Additionally, he dedicated his time to cultivating vegetable gardens, where he found joy in tending to the vibrant produce. These pursuits, along with deepening his understanding of Jewish texts through Talmud and Torah study, brought him immense satisfaction and purpose.

A graveside burial service will be held at Sparkman/Hillcrest Funeral Home & Memorial Park, located at 7405 West Northwest Highway, Dallas, Texas 75225, on Sunday, June 16, 2024, at 11:00 AM, officiated by Rabbi Craig Rosenstein.
